Dear Sir:-

We send to-day settlement for lots 5, 6, 7 and 8, Reco Ore. We should like ^{it} very much if you would make some arrangement, whereby we could compare assays upon each lot before making settlement. Upon ore of this grade a trifling difference in the heat of the furnace may make a difference of several ounces in the silver assay. We supposed that Mr. Smith would compare with us, inasmuch as he is your representative here, but he states that he has instructions not to compare. For our own satisfaction, we have sent several samples to a public assayer in town, in order to check our work. Lot 5 was the first lot of first-class ore, and, as it ran lower in silver than we had expected, from the information received from Mr. Wagner, we had both the original and duplicate assayed by Mr. Wood. His average assay is somewhat below that obtained by us. We enclose his certificate. In sampling this ore, we put the entire lot through the crusher and rolls and then through the automatic sampler, which makes two cuts, taking out a total of about 10%. This amount is quartered down into two samples, original and duplicate. There is no doubt about the

correctness of the sample thus obtained. As we have already stated, a difference in assays can easily occur unless we have a check, and we trust that you will see the advisability of making some such arrangement. Meanwhile, if the assays upon any of the lots settled are not satisfactory, we shall be glad to submit the samples to umpire.
