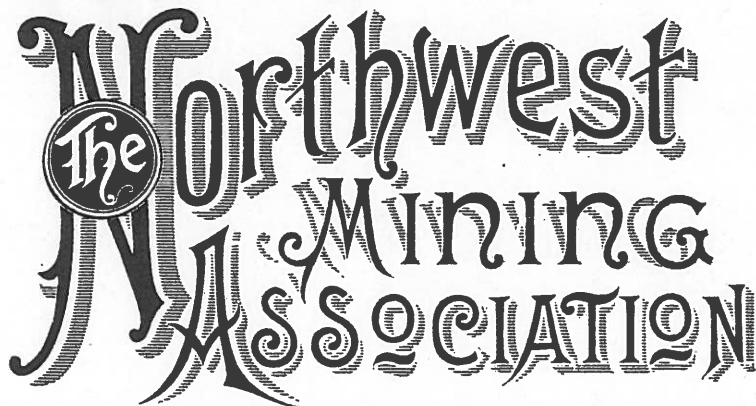

Gentlemen:—

This Association has had one year of anxious earnest active life, during which time it had had, in addition to questions of law and custom governing mining, to solve the ways and means of financial subsistence, but like all meritorious movements actuated with a spirit of common interest, intensified by the recurring evidences of its own possibilities, which coupled with the loyalty of its co-workers, has lived, not however without a struggle, in providing the financial sinews of war, but nevertheless the year closed without a single dollar of debt. It begins its new and second year, more determined than ever to carry on and work out its destiny, with subject matter in hand enough, if successful, to stamp the Association indelibly and favorably upon the minds of the people as an unalterable and successful factor in the upbuilding of the mining industry of the Northwest. The scope and character of the work you are well informed upon, and can best judge of its effectiveness in the past. The only revenue the Association receives is from its membership fees of \$1.00, and which is inadequate to pay the expenses of the increased business of the coming year. The officials of the Association receive no remuneration whatever for their services, and will receive none. The expenses of the Association constitute as follows:—

(2). Assistant (new employee for the coming year) to do the increased detail work which has grown so enormously that it is absolutely necessary to employ one.
